Directions:

The goal is to make a haiku style poem with a Pi twist!

What is a Haiku?

Haiku poetry comes from Japan. A traditional haiku poem is created using just three lines and focusing on syllables. Each of the three lines is made up of a certain number of syllables. The first line has 5 syllable, the second line has 7 syllables and the third line has 5 syllables again. The poem does not need to rhyme.

What is a Pi-Ku?

A Pi-ku is a very special poem that we will be making on Pi Day! To celebrate the numbers of pi, it will have three lines like a haiku, but the first line will have 3 syllables, the second line will have 1 syllable and the third line will have 4 syllables.
